Norwich 100 Exhibition and Talks

OPEN DOORS - Visit this photographic exhibition, which will showcase 100 of Norwich's most loved places, to celebrate the centenary of The Norwich Society. Each place will represent the society's activities and campaigning over the decades, featuring both the familiar and the unexpected.

The threat to Bishop Bridge in 1923 prompted the founding of The Norwich Society to help protect Norwich's historic environment and encourage new development that will be worthy of our fine city.

The society has been championing the built environment and public spaces in Norwich and celebrating the city's unique character and beauty for 100 years. From saving the historic Elm Hill area from demolition in the 1920s, to recent campaigning for better development of the Anglia Square site.

Alongside the exhibition, there will be two talks on how the society was established and the buildings they've protected, as well as the chance for visitors to see some slideshows and nominate their own favourite places in the city for the 'People's Choice'.

TALK - The decision to demolish Bishop Bridge was the catalyst that brought The Norwich Society into being in 1923. Speaker Jonathan Hooton tells the story of how they managed to save this part of our heritage.

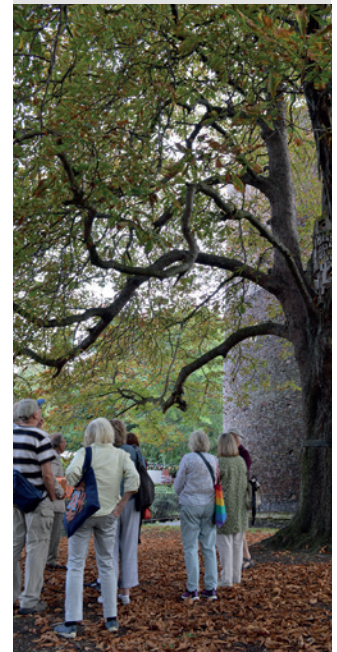

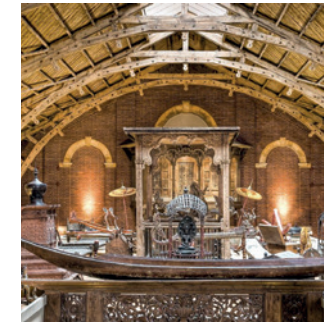

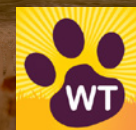
